



GARMENT WEAVING WORKSHOP

There are two goals for this workshop:

- 1) Each participant will design her/his own garment and make a muslin prototype. Once you make it, you won't need to make it again (unless you change shape).
- 2) Each participant will be able to design any garment from scratch, without needing to copy someone else's design. The point is to make garments uniquely one's own.

Supplies: Pencil, paper, scissors, tape measure, yarn scraps, crochet hooks, tapestry needle, loosely woven fabric (not handwoven, necessarily), muslin or old sheets.

If you have yardage already woven, bring it in, we'll make a garment out of it.

SCHEDULE:

1. Designing Cloth - pattern weaving a color (briefly)
2. Designing shapes - the basics
SWG garment group experience
On vs. Off loom shapes
using a small loom for garments
3. Design your own garment, on paper and with muslin
4. Lunch and slides of garments.
5. Finishing -
6. Joining and edges - types (practice with old yarn and fabric)
7. Pockets, bottoms, etc.
8. Individual garments
9. Dinner!
