Try to bring these 3 to the next meeting. 8 is a wrapping; - bring it or we can do it there. 9 is a bound weave and Amy will bring samples and discuss this weave during the workshop 11 and 13 are to be done on one warp and 12 is another wrapping. Our tentative goal is to get through the 12 exercises by the April meeting so we can do something different in May (meet with the guild on the coast, we hope!) but we can discuss this schedule. Summer will be catch-up time for those who need that and start-on-projects time. We'll finish the color study in the fall. NEW MEMBERS - welcome! Please know you are invited to stay for the workshop and some of us will be glad, during lunch break, to show you what we've done so far. Seeing isn't as rewarding as doing, but you can profit from it and we will profit from going over it again.
