Our SEPTEMBER meeting will a WORKSHOP on WARP EMBELLISHMENTS at Kim Whitt's farm, Sweetwater Studio, Route 2, Box 109, Moselle, MS 39459, (601) 584-8035. Enclosed you will find a map to the farm. If you are planning to come, please let us know by returning the form enclosed. The date is September 21, 1985. Kim sends instructions for participants as follows:

Bring with you:

preferably with no color.

(1) A narrow (6"-12") 100% cotton/warp 2-3 yards long that has been washed in hot soapy water and rinsed. If possible, soak the warp in 1/2 cup washing soda (soda ash) for 30 min. If you have no soda ash, no problem, you can do it here. Allow to dry preferably under tension.

(2) Any fiber reactive dye you may like and have on hand, but there will be

some here.

(3) Small jars (3-4), brushes (1/1"-1") or foam brushes, extra cheap yarn (acrylic best because it won't dye), scissors, dye clothes, and 2 dowels, rods or bars wide enough for your warp.

(4) A brown bag picnic lunch for you. Beverages & extra goodies will be here.

(5) A silk screen and squeegy if you have it. There will be one here, but more would be fun.

We will do painted warp and silk screened warp, so if you have any additional information, examples or anything to share, bring that too! The sett for your warp depends on what item you'd like. Beautiful effects are possible with a loose 50/50 weave or a close warp face.

Kim is just back from Arrowmont where she studied for two weeks with James Bassler, Art Professor from UCLA, and she's eager to pass along those nuggets of wisdom to us!
