April Meeting

This year teh Sheep-to-Shawl will be held on April 27 in conjunction with Heritage Day at the Ag Museum. We will meet at the farm house at 9am. Wear long skirts or period costumes if you have them, if not, period blue jeans will be fine.

There will be something for everybody to do, including novices: sort, card (spinners, bring cards), ply, skein (spinners, bring niddy noddys), wash, dye, weave an dknit (knitters, bring needles and acrylic for nursing home project).

At least 2 people are needed in each area. Please call Tina at 673-9114 or Margaret P. at 992-0715 or 992-9184 to volunteer or be assigned an area to ensure all areas are covered. We will weave a shawl from the wool of Ag Museum sheep and possibly present it to the Ag Museum for future publicity for the Sheep-to-Shawl. Tina will set us up in chronological order and set up a "learning corner" for those of the public who would like to learn.

If you would like to have some woollddyed, please bring skeined, washed, and "figure-eighted" wool. There will be a limited amount of space due to small number of dye pots. Each dye pot will hold 1 pound.

Bring a sack lunch and plan to spend the day. Business meeting will be held during lunch at 11:30.

The May meeting is a warp embellishment workshop by Kim Whitt, to be held on May 11 at the Trace Craft Center. There is a \$10 fee for participation in the program; make check payable to Chimneyville Weavers Guild and mail to Virginia Rogers, 117 East Hill Drive, Madison, MS 39110. Space is limited, so send money soon.

Warp Embellishment and What To Do With It -- instructor, Kim Whitt

Description: Discussion, demonstration and hands-on time for warp embellishment techniques including painted warp, multiple layers of painted warp, bleaching, bleeding, over-dyeing and ikat tying and dyeing. Mixing and using fiber reactive dyes will be explained and available for participants.

Lecture demonstration and open discussion of the composition, weaving and finishing of the students' warps will be covered emphasizing unconventional and conventional methods and materials either for fabrics or fiber arts.

Warp Preparation: Any form of a warp under tension can be used to produce a sample-sized project. Having a hard surface under the warp works best either with the warp on a loom (lap, table top, or small portable) or off the loom and stretched out over a table. More details of warp preparation and supplies needed will be sent to participants when Virginia receives your fee.

About the Instructor: Kim Whitt has been working with painted warp and ikat dyeing techniques for 11 years. She has studied weaving and dyeing at Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts and Haystack School of Design under James Bassler, Virginia West, Cynthia Shira and many othes. Currently Kim works out of her home-based studio in Moselle, MS, outside of Hattiesburg, producing dyed and woven fiber arts for the wall and sculpture.

Margaret Pittman. Row 1: Cast on 4 sts. Row 2: K 2 sts., YO, K to end of row. Repeat Row 2 until there are 43 sts. Next Row: K1, K 2 tog, YO, K 2 tog, K to end. Continue the last row until 4 sts. remain. K 4 sts and bind off. If you have questions, contact Margaret P., or Tina.
