# Notes/Announcements


Tina is talking about starting a new spinning class and will give us more deatils at the September meeting. A possible guideline for her class will be the certificate of execulence.

FOR SALE; Corrugated paper as a warp "separater". 48" wide, 15¢ per foot. Can be cut if your loom is not that wide. Contact Marva Goodman, 992-0383.

Easy way to stiffen Margaret Pittman's flat angel doilies: Buy doily stiffener from the craft store (comes in a pink bottle). In a small margerine tub (or throw away container) or washable bowl, mix doily stiffener and water about half and half. Dip doily and squeeze out excess. Spread out on aluminum foil (anything else sticks to doily). Shape and spread with fingers; no need to pin. Can flute wings a little if desired. When dry, tie ribbons from tops of wings to hang. Can crochet chains instead. Spray glitter gives these a little extra sparkle if desired.


