

SPRING WEAVING CLASS

Weaving Classes will be offered on a modular system, open to students who have taken a beginning weaving class. The modules are as follows:

plain weave and its derivatives (basket weave, rep, tapestry etc.)

twills Module 2:

unit weaves (huck, M's & O's, Sweedish lace, etc.) Module 3:

block weaves (overshot, summer & winter, monk's belts, crackle, Module 4:

etc.) complex weaves (more than 8 or special weave) Module 6:

color (and color & weave effects) Module 7:

fabric analysis and design (must be extremely familiar with Module 8: drafting).

Students will choose a specific weave structure within a module, and plan a project of their own; thus it is possible to repeat a module. Students wanting to learn about a specific item, for example lace, or rugs, should sign up for the appropriate module (unit weaves or twills for lace, modules 1, 2, or 4 for rugs). Students provide their own yarns; a limited number of yarns are available to students in the studio at a minimal charge. Spring class starts on Tuesday Mark 29 and continues thereafter on Tuesday evenings through May 31. Registration starts immediately till March 25. Your registration is final after payment has been made. Cost is \$95 (\$80 plus \$15 loom fee).
