**Class Description:** Participants will learn the basics of pin loom weaving by making and embellishing a Pin Person.

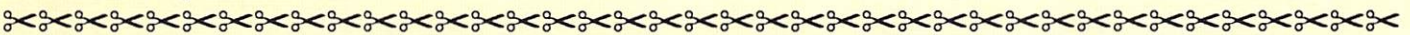
