# Majesty of Spain

## Royal Collections from the Museo del Prado and Patrimonio Nacional

Mississippi Arts Pavilion, Jackson, Miss.

As someone brilliantly proposed at a CWSG meeting this year, we are trying to arrange a group tour of the exhibit and a special presentation on its magnificent tapestries from the Royal Tapestry Factory in Madrid.

The factory has been making carpets and tapestries since 1721. The Majesty of Spain exhibit features numerous tapestries—18 of them by Goya—in nearly every gallery. Some of them are woven with spun gold!

Events coordinator Patrick Johnson has offered to see if Jack Kyle, exhibit executive director, can spend 15 to 20 minutes with us talking about the tapestries, which he hand picked for the exhibit. This would be done in a meeting room, to avoid distracting other viewers.

First, we need to decide how many can go and when as soon as possible so Patrick can make arrangements with Mr. Kyle. We *must* make plans early to have any chance of catching Mr. Kyle, whose calendar fills fast. If you want to participate, **please return this form to Debbie Stringer or call immediately**. Patrick suggested a Sunday afternoon, when crowds are smaller and a meeting room is free for Mr. Kyle's talk with us.

By attending as a group of 20 or more we save \$2 per person on admission fees. If we have fewer than 20, we pay full price of \$15.
