Treasurer's Report:

Regular account: \$3,606.78. \$738.00 for resource(books, etc.) Total= \$3837.04

The workshop brought in \$95.00 to our resource account for purchasing books and magazines. White Elephant: \$15.00. With this income we now have \$738.00 in the resource account. We have more than adequate resources to buy books, resource guides, etc., and pay for ceiling fans for front porch, name tags, etc., as the guild votes.

We also received additional membership dues of \$30.00, and paid \$78.00 for one year's rent for our P.O. Box, and all bills currently paid.

Announcements/Reminders:

 - 1. DO NOT BRING PIECES to the meeting, just the completed list
 - 2. Bring the *completed* list to the meeting, I will collect them at the beginning of the meeting, so I can organize them during the meeting, before the program. Just let Synnove know if you are planning on bringing it, so I have some idea of how to plan
 - 3. What if you are a beginner and haven't completed 10 pieces? You can still participate, just list the pieces (or skeins as the case may be) you have completed and write at the bottom that this is a completed list. Yes, you can list any work in progress, which is actually on the loom(s), spinning wheel(s) or knitting needles. The important things are: that you truly list the last 10 pieces, and not jump around. And that your information be as complete and accurate as possible.
