We will be threading beads onto <u>copper, stainless and brass wire</u>. <u>Any type of small trinkets with a hole</u> will work including very small fishing lures, computer parts, etc. The keyword is 'small.' I (Margaret) will bring the remainder and think everyone will enjoy.

• *Karin Roberson and Rissa Root* attended/helped Lilly Chin "World's Fastest Crocheter" with her program/workshop at Needlearts in Natchez in April.

• *Debbie Stringer* wrote, "I'm weaving about 20 bookmarks for an online bookmark exchange with a group of weavers from the weaving list. I'm using textile paints, a stamp I carved and a brush to apply a design to the 10/2 perle cotton warp (in natural) on the loom before each bookmark is woven. Sett is 30 epi; weft is the same as the warp but unpainted. The result is not a bold, clear design but rather a soft, faded look (think vintage cottons). I can e-mail (news@epaofms.com) a photo to anyone interested in the technique."

•A note from Synnove

How's your history knowledge?

From last month - (I believe Sandi Tucker has contacted the State Archives and will share any information she receives, but I haven't heard from anyone else ...):

• Interesting tidbit: From the April 10, 2006 <u>US News & World Report</u> issue: A VIEW TO A KILT The Scottish Declaration of Independence was signed in 1320 – and much later used as a model for the American one. So it is only right that Scottish-Americans are honored with National Tartan Day. In New York City, kelt wearers will parade down the avenue of the americas on April 8. And Mississippi has

honored its Scots by adopting official state tartan.

Speaking of dates:1320 and earlier ... Last week I enjoyed visiting friends who live in northern CA, near several redwood groves - truly magnificent trees! I found myself saying, "Awesome!" and it was appropriate.

One "slice" of redwood (@9feet in diameter) had growth rings labeled from 1066 to about 1991 when it fell. To name just a few dates, and what at least the first date has to do with the fiber world ...:

1066, the Battle Hastings - the Norman Conquest- beginning of Anglo-Saxon and immense influence on language and culture, which was immortalized in the Bayeux

Tapestries, a 231-foot long piece of embroidery with colored wools on linen a little over 900 years ago to commemorate the battle (see National Geographic, August, 1966 for a wonderful article and fabulous pictures of the tapestry);

1215: Magna Carta - in England, served as basis for English guarantee of civil rights, influential in our history as well as that of many other countries;

1492 ... ;

1620: Plymouth Rock;

1776 ... :

1945: end of WWII ... and several other remarkable date. Now, that's historical ...
