Regular account: \$3,312.44. \$524.02 for resource (books, etc.) Total= \$3,836.46.

New business:

• Member directories were e- mailed prior to Sept. meeting, and hard copies and covers, with activity calendar for the year, were also available.

• Carolyn introduced the <u>Committee Boards</u>, delineating tasks and responsibilities for each committee, with space for folks to sign up. These will be available at every meeting.

A <u>Spin In Board</u> was also presented, with hopes that we could start up this enjoyable practice again. <u>Mentor Board</u>, with spaces for folks and months for people to serve as mentors for weaving, spinning, and even knitting.

• Carolyn presented the issue of a Lace Workshop for March and asked for a vote. A motion was made, seconded, and voted (approved) to host the workshop (see below in Board minutes).

• Carolyn announced the need for a new Secretary. Karin Roberson volunteered and was gratefully accepted by both Carolyn and Synnove.

Reports:

• Board Meeting. The Board met before the meeting and the following items were discussed:

• Question about when the following events occur:

Roc Day: Hosts - every 5 years. Our turn is 2008,

Fiber Forum: Guilds volunteer to host ... when would be our turn?

<u>Retreat</u>: Do we want to do this again? Our Guild used to do this, but we have not done this in many years ...

- Update of Policies and Procedures: These policies and procedures were last updated in 1999. All members need to make notes about changes that are necessary and give them to the Board, which will then present them to the membership for approval.
- Scholarship: The board is interested in paying tuition for the following;
 - 1. for HGA -

2. workshop tuition - such as Learning Exchange or TLC

3. Tuition for Weaving Class

We are working on how to determine who would get a scholarship - an application process would be appropriate.

• Chemo caps: Whatever happened to that project? Several members knitted chemo caps ... What is to be done with them?

• Mentors: Suggest that one a month be available. Folks would sign up to be mentors for weaving and/or spinning ...

• Silent auction: Whether or not to have it ... If we do, we need to start bidding at a "respectful" amount - this auction is not the same as "White Elephant".

• Web site: Our guild needs a web site, which will will be available to the public - providing them with basic information about our guild, workshops, etc. -, as well as providing a site at which the

members will be able to "chat." We need a web master who will build one and give the Board recommendations to be approved before it is implemented. The Board will check on costs for establishing a public website, etc.

• Lace Workshop with Linda Webhorse - To present a workshop, 1st. wk.end in March. Cost would be \$400.00 to bring her here for a Fri. night, Sat., and Sun. Possible sight for the workshop would be Hinds Community College in Brandon – cost would be \$50 a day for a program" Lace Weave - Simple to Sublime." 10 folks for the workshop would be ideal -15 OK. If not enough people sign up by Oct. meeting, we will open to other guilds, public, etc.

The meeting was adjourned for our program: Rag Strip Weaving with Debbie Stringer. Great job Debbie - many very interesting pieces were made! (Please bring the rag strip weaving you made at our September meeting). Respectfully submitted, Synnove Heggoy
