

## From I-55 N

Take Exit the Old Agency Exit (103)

At the traffic circle at Highland Colony, take the Old Agency Road toward Livingston Road. (There are two Old Agency Roads – one is the old one and it dead ends. You want the new one that goes past Dinsmoor)

Continue on Old Agency until it dead ends into Livingston Road

Turn right onto Livingston Road and continue until the road forks. The fork to the left is Livingston Road, you do not want this. You want to keep straight which is Lake Cavalier Road.

Continue until you get to 414 Lake Cavalier Road. It will be on the right and has a white picket fence. Kathy will also have balloons on the mailbox.
