I know we are all looking forward to the opening of


#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

## February CWSG Program— Weave a Pin

Come prepared to take part in a fun, hands-on (and easy) weaving activity during our

February meeting. We will make wearable art using a simple needle-weaving technique on a warp wrapped around a small piece of black mat board. No weaving experience necessary.

Winki has offered to lead the program in Debbie's absence. You will be supplied with some of the materials and a handout, but you should bring the following:

- tapestry needle
- small pair of scissors
- small amounts of yarns in various colors and textures (anything goes as long as it can be threaded through your tapestry needle's eye)
- optional embellishments: small beads, small decorative button, craft wire.

### New Library Book Review: In Sheep's Clothing: A Handspinner's Guide to Wool Donna Peyton

This book by Nola and Jane Fournier from Interweave Press was originally published in 1995 and is still considered one of the most definitive books on wool for spinners. The book gives a great overview of wool in general before discussing the different types of wool breeds. *In Sheep's Clothing* also covers selecting, sorting, and storing fleece, as well as how to blend wool for spinning.

COTTON — Marcy Petrini discusses the fiber quiz she gave CWSG members with Jenni Howard at the January meeting. Marcy presented the history of cotton as well information for spinning, weaving and knitting with cotton. In the 14th century, Sir John Mandeville described cotton as "a wonderful tree with tiny lambs at the end of its branches which are so pliable that can bend and reach the ground to allow the tiny lambs to eat when they are hungry." Hence the German name "baumwolle" or tree-wool. Cotton and its cousins, hibiscus and okra, are still Southern favorites.

Winki Allen, president, called the meeting to order at 9:58 a.m. She welcomed Judy Rayner who had been seriously ill and hospitalized for weeks last year. Judy thanked everyone for their kind wishes and prayers. Individual introductions were made, and Kathy Perito, a weaving student of Marcy's, was welcomed as a visitor.

Winki announced the consideration of old business. The guild show, Birds, Blooms and Butterflies, was discussed. Winki said Sharon Williams asked if Donna Peyton would assist with set up of the show by receiving works brought to the guild meeting. The show will be held in February in the small gallery at the Center.

Five new books are now available in the CWSG library. Donna showed each book and noted there is \$100 remaining in the library fund.

Winki opened discussion on the organization of Sheep to Shawl and asked for volunteers. The annual event is scheduled for Mar. 3, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Craft Center. Volunteers are: event organization - Nancy, Donna; spinning - Donna, Winki; weaving - Debbie; knitting -Donna; children's activities - Darlene, Gio; fiber animals - Jenni, Larry; publicity - Alma. It was mentioned that Brenda and Mike Harrower will probably agree to spin and weave. Nancy mentioned "pounding" prints featured at the November meeting as a good activity for children. Jane Dollar will be asked to dye. Alma will do a press release and flyer. Winki suggested Alma contact Craft Center volunteer Pat Flynn about additional publicity. Debbie will include information in the Today in Mississippi newsletter with Alma's cell phone number as a contact number. Alma will bring flyers to the February meeting. Gio mentioned signs were previously done, and someone should check with Sherry Cox to locate these to be used again. Members will all bring a dish to share for the day.

Winki asked for new business. Nancy mentioned CWSG should look into a workshop with India Flint while she is in New Orleans in 2013. Winki asked Nancy if she would make that contact.

Debbie announced a February program change. Debbie was scheduled to present a program on Saori weaving, but she will be out of town. She asked members to allow her to change the program to a hands-on pin weaving workshop. Debbie will supply the materials. It was suggested by members that Debbie might present the Saori weaving as a summer workshop. Nancy volunteered her studio. Dates in July or August were discussed, with the reminder that Convergence is in July. Marcy announced she will be holding a day of indigo dyeing at the Craft Center on Sat., Aug. 25. The date strongly considered for the Saori weaving workshop was the third Sat., Aug. 18.

Winki shared with the group that a local church congregation is using the Craft Center library, CWSG's regular meeting room, for services on Sunday mornings. The guild will be asked to use the Harbor Room at times, although hearing can be an issue in that room. When we do use the library, we will need to leave it arranged as it is for the church service when we leave.

Winki asked members about their preference for the December 2012 meeting. Do members want to meet with the rug hooking group in Canton again? There was discussion about the meeting being held at the jail or another location, and the opening up of the gift exchange to the entire group rather than dividing into two groups as done in December 2011. Members agreed they enjoyed the joint holiday party and want to participate again. Barbara mentioned that the Wool Dust Society meets on the second Saturday of each month.

Members held a short Show and Tell session which included rust dyeing and woven projects. Marcy had mentioned Winki's rust dyeing to Sandy Bowles with the Hand Weavers Guild of America, and she will be doing an article on this for *Spindle Shuttle and Dyepot* in the future.

Kathy Perito joined CWSG as a new member.

The meeting adjourned to the Harbour View Room for Marcy's program on cotton spinning and weaving.
