The board met during the summer get-together at Nancy Landrum's home in Meridian. The meeting was called to order at 1:25 p.m. Winki asked to discuss the programs scheduled for the upcoming 2012-2013 year. Debbie said every monthly program had been determined except for January. A suggestion was made that the guild could plan a day trip to the Knit 1 Fiber Festival in Oxford during January since the festival falls on the same weekend as the guild's regular meeting. Alma volunteered to get prices for renting a van for the trip.

Debbie said an alternative program might be "dinner and a movie" at her office in Ridgeland. Marcy had mentioned *The Weaverly Path*, a DVD featuring tapestry artist Silvia Heyden. *Blue Alchemy*, a movie about indigo dyeing around the world was also suggested.

The board agreed members would need to vote on the January day trip meeting. The February show at the Craft Center was brought up. The name "Making Do: Fiber Art from Materials at Hand" was suggested. Sharon usually accepts pieces for the show at the January meeting which has in recent years remained in the gallery longer than the usual month.

Other business mentioned included the election of officers at the end of the program year. Alma agreed to send an email to the Sheep to Shawl sign-up list with an application to the guild. It was also mentioned that when a flyer is created for the 2013 Sheep to Shawl, a line needs to be added that sheep will be sheared "weather permitting."
