the exit after Briarwood; if you get to County Line Road, you've gone too far. At the exit, cross all lines of traffic on Frontage Road and take a right from Frontage Road onto Adkins at the light. Make sure you're in the middle lane and go straight at the light at the corner of Adkins and Ridgewood.

## Coming from the north, going south:

From I-55, take the Adkins/Beasley exit, it's the exit after County Line Road; if you get to Briarwood Road, you have gone too far. At the exit, take a right onto Adkins at the light, go under the I-55 bridge, and go straight at the light after the bridge at the corner of Adkins and Frontage Road; the lanes of traffic are confusing, make sure you're in the lanes going straight. Continue to go straight, make sure you're in the middle lane and go straight at the light at the corner of Adkins and Ridgewood.

## From Adkins Drive:

Adkins becomes a two-lane road after the light. Fairfax is the 1st and 2nd right on Adkins; it's a semi-circle. Take the 2nd turn onto Fairfax; Marcy's house is the first house on the left after the corner house. It's a cedar shingle house with the porch facing the driveway.

President Winki Allen called the October meeting to order at 10:16 a.m., welcoming members to the November meeting. She thanked Margaret for providing refreshments for the meeting and Debbie for allowing the guild to meet at the Electric Power Association offices.

Old business: Winki has had a conversation with Sheri Cox at the Craftsmen's Center about Sheep to Shawl. March 16, the third Saturday, has been booked for a wedding. March 2 and 9 are the only Saturdays the Craftsmen's Center is available in March. After Sheep to Shawl last year there had been conversation about holding it in April when the weather tends to be warmer for shearing. It was suggested that it would be best to consult members who provide the animals for shearing and allow them to make the best decision for a date. Winki will check with these members. Marva was asked if she minded changing her April basket weaving program to March. Marva said she would check her March calendar, that changing shouldn't be a problem depending on her schedule.

New business: Marcy mentioned that changes are being made at the Chimneyville Crafts Festival on Nov. 30 through Dec. 2, to expand into the second section of the Trade Mart. A "fiber village" will be created in the new area, and Marcy asked for volunteers to demonstrate fiber crafts during the

Chimneyville weekend. Winki, Debbie, Marva, Jo, Gayle, Beth and Margaret volunteered to weave, spin and knit. CWSG will have flyers in the fiber area.

Winki mentioned the December meeting, and said some members had expressed that they wanted to return to the traditional "Loom Crawl" meeting at a member's home rather than meeting again in Canton at the Old Jail with the rug hooking society headquartered at the P is for Primitive shop. Everyone had a great time last year but missed getting to visit with fellow CWSG members. It was decided to poll members via email. Winki said she will contact Lisanne Miller after the outcome was determined.

Members held Show and Tell for the month, showing dyed fabrics using the techniques form the October program and weaving, sewing and knitting projects.

The meeting was adjourned for the program at 11:26 a.m. Members watched the documentary, *A Weaverly Path*, featuring the life and work of tapestry weaver, Silvia Heyden.
