
## **Nominations for Officers**




# Brenda Wins a Blue

Brenda Harrower attended the Jefferson City Fiber Retreat in Jefferson City, Missouri, in March. She won

the blue ribbon in spinning for art yarns in a competitive category. She took a day and a half seminar on beginning weaving, learning how to figure warp, dress the loom, and do some basic weaving. The instructor also taught her how to do overshot. He told Brenda she was the first student he had ever let go that far in a beginning weaving class. Must be the company she keeps!

# **My Projects - Gio Chinchar**





Gio is one of the most prolific and exacting weavers in the Guild. Always weaving beautiful projects, Gio is known for her towels and scarves. Gio shared photos of her recent projects and a current threading. "For Christmas, I received American Maid Naturally Colored cotton in dark green, light green, dark brown, and natural. One set of towels I wove in eight harness broken twill blocks (towel in middle), the next set (on left) I wove as an eight shaft spot weave, and the set I'm doing now is going to be woven as an eight shaft ribbed squares (on right). The last set I plan to weave will be an eight shaft waffle weave.

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# **My Projects - Rita Grice**





Rita knits, spins and weaves. She shared several finished projects including a hat for her grandson modeled by the little bear and a purple scarf done on her triangle loom. "Spring has sprung and my husband wants a flower garden—two of them—so I have been busy weeding, buying plants, and taking up a rock garden to convert to a flower bed. I have just finished a baby hat knit for my 4-month-old grandson for next winter and a baby blanket that was knit in garter on two different size needles to give it an unusual look. I have three knitting projects in the VERY early stages and nothing on my looms this week."

President Donna Peyton called the meeting to order at 10:04 p.m. Member Patricia Holmberg who was to present the monthly program on inkle weaving was unable to attend; it was decided the meeting would focus on April Sheep to Shawl planning.

First, members talked about taking more time during or around the time of monthly meetings next year to weave and spin together. Members also discussed being more respectful in regard to side discussions during show and tell so that everyone can hear.

Donna announced it was time for nominations for several board positions. Kathy has resigned as librarian/historian. The secretary/newsletter editor and treasurer positions are up for election in 2014. Winki and Nancy volunteered to serve as the Nomination Committee. Donna mentioned that the Guild would work on revising its by-laws over the summer.

Nichol, Sheep to Shawl chair, contacted Jenny and Larry Howard, former members who have been bringing their sheep and alpacas for the last several years. The Howards are moving to Florida. Members were asked to help with finding sheep if they had any leads. Nichol mentioned her plan for creating a wooden sheep with an attached fleece. Beth brought a fleece to the meeting.

Donna said the Craft Center did not have a problem with members bringing dishes to share for the S2S lunch for members as done in past years. This had been a concern since S2S is part of the Craft by the Trace weekend this year.

Debbie will update the S2S flyer she developed last year and send it to the Craft Center and others. Jane mentioned that scrap yarn is needed. Donna said her Latin II students, all boys, are studying the drop spindle, and she has asked them to attend.

Nichol reviewed all S2S assignments. Winki asked and Nichol agreed to send an email to members with the assignment list. There was a discussion about set up and needing some small tables.

Donna asked Alma to check with Carolyn to see if the Craft Center had been paid for Roc Day.

Nancy and Winki have both had items accepted for exhibition at Convergence in July. Winki will be leading a three-day workshop for Phyllis at Mississippi State on April 22-24. Winki's new website is www.winkisilks.com.

Show and tell followed the review of business, and the meeting was adjourned at 11:29 a.m.
