The fiber community will miss the infectious smile of Elizabeth Wynne Lewis of Coldwater, MS, who passed away on Saturday, October 25, 2014 at home, surrounded by her loved ones and her beautiful textiles.

A visit to Elizabeth's home was a treat for the eyes; using jewel tones of cotton, Tencel® and bamboo, she wove scarves, shawls, blankets and other accessories that sparkled and won many awards, the most recent of which a first place in hand-weaving and a Best of Shaw award for the 2014 "Fantastic Fiber Expressions", and 1st place in fiber arts for the 2014 National American Heritage Exhibit of the Daughters of the American Revolution of which she was a member.

An educator for more than 30 years, Elizabeth's generous spirit gave back much to her community, serving in leadership positions of many organizations, notably the Sycamore Arts Council and the Tate County Heritage Museum. Her family has established a scholarship in her name at the Northwest Mississippi Community College.

NOVEMBER MINUTES

Guild members gathered on Saturday, November 15 at 10 am. President Donna Peyton suggested that it's time for us to review our bylaws. We further discussed the idea of bringing master spinner Mary Russman from TN for a guild presentation. The consensus was that we would prefer for Ms. Russman to offer a full-fledged class vs. a short program at a guild meeting. We will work through guild member Nichol Treuil to coordinate this event.

Our annual Christmas get-together this year will be held on Saturday, December 13 (note that this is the *second* Saturday of the month vs. our regular third Saturday meeting day) at 10 am here at the MS Craft Center. Everyone is invited to bring a loom or spinning wheel, plus food to share. We will weave, spin, eat, drink and exchange gifts. What more could we want?

We discussed plans for the upcoming Chimneyville Crafts Festival to be held December 6 & 7 at the Trade Mart in Jackson. Guild members are invited to demonstrate fiber arts throughout the day on Saturday and Sunday. Contact Debbie Stringer to let her know when you can be there and what you will demonstrate. Rumor has it that demonstrators receive free tickets to Friday night's opening.

ROC day will be held January 10 in New Orleans. Remember to register by December 10. Several guild members (Marcy Petrini, Brenda Harrower) will have booths there.

During show and tell Carolyn Campbell showed the eco-dyed scarves she completed at a workshop by Winki Allen. Carolyn Campbell and Donna Peyton showed the felted critters they created at our October meeting.

Donna Peyton gave a program on Kool-Aid dyeing, complete with recipes. She wraps the yarn to be dyed in a ball or in a skein and used vinegar as mordant. She heats the dye bath and yarn in the microwave on high for two minutes. She reports that rinsing is optional. Donna reports that food coloring and Easter egg dyes can also be used successfully.

Those present included Carolyn Campbell, Alma Ellis, Beth Palmer, Marcy Petrini, Donna Peyton, and Margaret Richardson.
