SEPTEMBER MINUTES

We gathered on Saturday, September 19, 2015 at Debbie Stringer's office at the Electrical Power Associations of MS for our regular meeting. The board met at 9 am and the guild meeting began at 10 am. We had 13 members present for the meeting.

The minutes from May were presented in the September newsletter. Debbie Stringer moved that the minutes be accepted as presented. Marcy Petrini seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

The current financial report was included in the September newsletter.

Under Old Business, Brenda Harrower brought up the topic of hosting a spinning workshop on exotic fibers on Saturday, November 7. Expert spinner Mary Lessman would lead the workshop. Debbie Stringer offered to determine whether the conference room at the EPA offices might be available for the workshop. Discussion ensued regarding the cost of the workshop and the amount to be paid by participants. Brenda offered to secure a draft contract from Ms. Lessman and share it with the guild. Nancy Landrum generously offered her studio in Meridian for our annual loom crawl to be held on Saturday, December 12.

Under New Business, the question arose about whether the guild still operates a Facebook page. Debbie Stringer offered to investigate.

Guild members discussed the possibility of adding a link from the guild web page to The Woolery's web page. The Woolery will refund to the guild 5% of any sales generated by that link. Marcy Petrini offered to have our web master establish that link.

Convergence '16 takes place July 30 to August 6 in Milwaukee. Look for more info in upcoming issues of Weave, Spin, Dye. Guild member Kathy Perito has been appointed to the board of the Handweavers' Guild of America (HGA). Winki Allen is the MS representative.

The MS state charter for our guild uses Marcy Petrini's address and lists officers Marcy Petrini, Marva Goodman, Rosina Echols, and Jane Dollar. There's an online form that can be used to change this information. Alma Ellis offered to use the online form to add our email address to the information. This change will cost \$25. Beth Palmer moved to make the change. Debbie Stringer seconded the motion. The guild voted unanimously in favor of the motion.
