Two-Day Weaving Workshop: "Focus on the Warp"

Thursday, May 5 and Friday, May 6

9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Using hand-painted warps, weavers will learn to design effectively, efficiently with multiple warp chains which aid in creative designing on the loom. Loom required. Rigid heddle looms not suitable.

Workshop Fee

Material Fee - \$45/per student for 200 thread, 4 1/2 yard hand-painted warp

Limit of 12 students

One-Day Dyeing Workshop: "Not Your Grandma's Dye Pot"

Saturday, May 7

9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Students will learn the fundamentals for dye application to produce one of a kind, color-fast hand-dyed cotton yarn and fabric using seven shades of Fiber Reactive MX dyes. Students taught space-dyeing and resist techniques.

Workshop Fee

CWSG member - \$45

Non-member - \$55

Material Fee - \$25/per student (Students may bring cellulose fiber/fabric to dye or order ahead from instructor.)

Limit of 18 students



Kathrin Weber lives in the mountains of North Carolina. Weaving and dyeing since 1975, Kathrin focuses on color and the flow of color in her hand-dyed and handwoven work. She is a member of The American Craft Council, the Southern Highland Craft Guild, Piedmont Craftsmen and Carolina Designer Craftsmen. She teaches weaving at the John C. Campbell Folk School, Penland School of Crafts, and the Arrowmont School of Art and Craft.

We talked about the possibility of establishing focus groups to meet outside of regular guild meetings and study a topic from September through May.

Brenda Harrower reminded us about the Magnolia State Fiber Festival in Vicksburg June 3 and 4. Sharon Williams mentioned fiber artist Martina Celerin from Bloomington IN.

The meeting adjourned and we moved into our program on fiber art cuffs presented by Debbie Stringer.
