# January meeting minutes

We met on Saturday, Jan. 20, at the Mississippi Craft Center with 15 members present (i.e., a quorum). Margaret Pittman joined us as a guest. After determining that there were no changes to the proposed agenda, the minutes from the November meeting published in the December newsletter were approved.

Treasurer Nancy Hester announced that the current balance in our treasury is \$3,334.39 Nancy recently paid for a sixmonth renewal of our post office box in the amount of \$50 and was encouraged to submit her receipt for reimbursement. There ensued a lively discussion about the continued need for a PO box versus the challenges of checking it and keeping up with misplaced mail. Nancy reports that most of our incoming mail comes from either Handweavers Guild of America or the state. Our non-profit registration with the state requires a physical address rather than a PO box. We currently use Marcy Petrini's address for that purpose. All agreed that we need a fuller discussion of this issue before the PO box comes up for renewal again in six months.

Sharon Williams reminded members about our upcoming show, which will hang in the George Berry gallery at the Mississippi Craft Center during September. (Note that this is a change from the previously announced date of April.) The theme for the show is "Here Comes the Sun." Participants should deliver their items to the Craft Center by August. The show moves to Northwest Community College in October.

Under Old Business, we discussed the possibility of holding a guild retreat, possibly June 8-10, at either Lake Tiak-O'Khata or the Gray Center. Both sites are about one hour from Jackson. Nancy Hester will put together a proposal for discussion at a future meeting.

Under New Business, Nicole Kadler suggests that the guild appoint a media coordinator to help publicize our presence and our work. Debbie Stringer currently manages our Facebook page and Donna Peyton manages our presence on Ravelry.

Also under New Business, Donna Peyton agreed to chair the upcoming sheep-to-shawl festival scheduled for Saturday, March 24, at the Mississippi Craft Center. Debbie Stringer will do publicity and our favorite shepherdess, Savannah, will join


