
President's Message:

September Meeting Minutes

The September meeting of CWSG was called to order by Donna Peyton in the absence of President Beth Palmer on Sept. 19, 2020, at 10 a.m. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the meeting was held by Zoom video-conferencing. A quorum was determined with 12 members present.

A motion to accept the agenda was presented by Lynn Watkins and seconded by Marcy Petrini; the agenda was accepted. The minutes from the May 16 meeting as printed in the June newsletter were accepted upon a motion by Marcy Petrini and seconded by Nancy Hester.

Donna reminded members that annual dues would be officially late after today's meeting. Treasurer Nancy Hester reported that 20 members have paid dues.

The proposed budget for 2020/2021 was presented. Marcy Petrini moved that we accept the budget. Debra Sue Pate seconded the motion. The budget was accepted as presented.

Several members of CWSG met with representatives of the Craftsmen's Guild of Mississippi and the Craft Center earlier this month to discuss possible changes in room rental for CWSG meetings and other events held at the William Waller Craft Center. Since no decisions had been made at the time of this meeting, details will be presented at a later date.

Upcoming events include National Spinning and Weaving Week, Oct. 5-11, 2020. Because of a conflict in scheduling the facility, the weaving and spinning demo day will be held at the Craft Center on Saturday, Oct. 3, 2020, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Members were invited to participate.


