The CWSG Holiday Party will be on Zoom on Sunday, Dec. 13, at 2 p.m. Seventeen members signed up for the gift exchange. Participants should mail their gifts to the recipients as soon as possible.

The rigid heddle workshop scheduled for May 15 is now full.

Discussion of a possible casual Roc Day gathering at the Craft Center prompted at least eight members attending the Zoom meeting to indicate they would participate. The date would be Jan. 9, 2021, if the decision is made to hold the event. More information on this will be forthcoming.

We will arrange ourselves six feet apart from one another and encourage any visitors to stand six feet away from us. We hope to

have the opportunity to observe Roc Day together and enjoy some spinning in community at the start of the New Year.

Also known as Distaff Day, Roc Day marks the resumption of work (for women, spinning; for men, ploughing) following the 12 Days of Christmas. Because of Covid, we are not able to gather with spinners from our regional guilds for our traditional Roc Day demonstration. We hope this much smaller gathering will serve to inspire us and others to embrace spinning in the New Year.
