

May 21, 2022: "In Olden Days: Fiber Work in Ancient Greece and Rome"








Member Show and Tell

- 2. Macomber 48" 8 harness. Double back beam. With bench. I will let this one go home with you for \$200... also upstairs in my studio. This was my primary loom for years, and helped me launch my scarf weaving career.

April 16, 2022 Meeting Minutes

The April meeting of the CWSG was called to order by President Nancy Hester on Saturday, April 16, 2022, at 10 a.m. on Zoom video conference. A quorum was determined with 13 members present.

Debra Sue Pate moved that the agenda be accepted. Alma Ellis seconded, and the motion was approved. The minutes of the March 26, 2022, meeting, as printed in the CWSG April 2022 newsletter, were approved upon a motion by Debbie Stringer and second by Marcy Petrini.

Nancy Hester read the slate of candidates for election as submitted by the nomination committee: Jeanne Marie Peet, Secretary; Janet Lee, Librarian/Historian; Heather Mitchell, Treasurer. Since there were no nominations from the floor, Beth Palmer moved that the slate of nominees be accepted by acclamation. Marcy Petrini seconded. The vote passed. Since there were no additional candidates added to the ballot, a tally of absentee ballots sent earlier by email was not necessary.

Because no projects or activities such as Sheep to Shawl or live demonstrations were held by the guild this past year, no committee reports were given.

The summer meeting, to be held on Zoom in lieu of a summer retreat, is tentatively set for a date in early August. More details will be announced at a later date.

The meeting was adjourned upon a motion by Jeanne Marie Peet.
